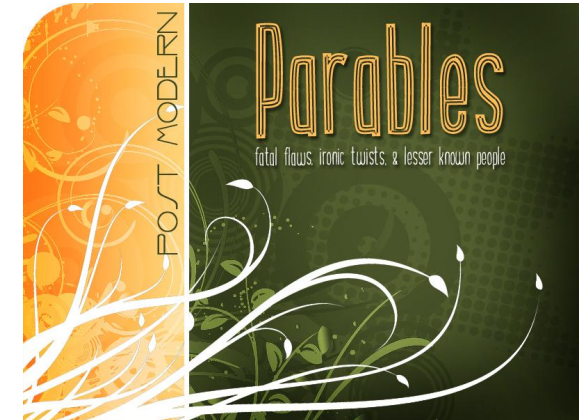

About Communion

Our Lord Jesus invites all people to come to Him (John 6:37). In this Holy Meal, He specifically invites those who trust in Him to receive not only bread and wine, but also His body and blood for the forgiveness of their sins (Matthew 26:26-28). Therefore, if we confess our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior, He invites us to receive this personal assurance: "Your sins are forgiven!" (1John 1:7-9).

The Bible offers guidance on preparation for the Lord's Supper: the importance of examining not only our faith in Jesus and our understanding of Communion, but also our attitudes, actions and relationships (1 Corinthians 10:6-17 and 1:17-34).

Baptism and instruction in the Christian faith are the formal steps in the process of preparation (Acts 2:38-42). However, personal preparation is still an individual matter between every believer and his Lord.

Guests who desire to commune here on a regular basis are asked to express their oneness in the faith by speaking to our pastor or by attending an instruction class. In this congregation, basic Christian instruction is normally provided to youth in first communion/confirmation classes for 6th, 7th and 8th graders and to all others in adult membership classes.

Mission of the Month: Joanie and Will Feuerstein

Will and Joanie have been serving in the Philippines since 2001 for FACE-2-Face Ministry. The heart of FACE-2-FACE is relational evangelism with a focus on compassion and mercy ministries. As advocates for the poor and prison inmates, they have followed the Lord from the province of Batangas to the mountains of Nueva Vizcaya to the business district of Makati and into the jails. They have strategic group ministries in the men and women's national prisons, Correctional Institution for Women in Mandaluyong, and maximum security of New Bilibid Prison in Muntinlupa. In January 2008 they launched a children's evangelistic ministry in Batangas. Their evangelism and advocacy continues in leadership involvement with the social welfare programs of the American Association of the Philippines and Philippine-American Guardian Association, assisting both Fil-Am children and Americans incarcerated in the Philippines. They serve with the core team of Couples Who Care at our local church, Greenhills Christian Fellowship, which also shares in their prison work.

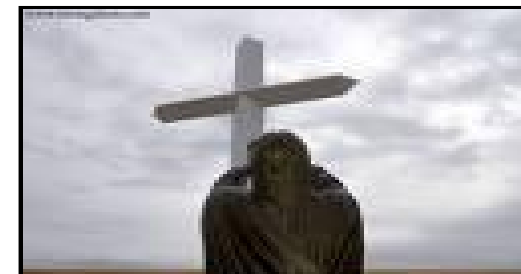

Are You a Christian?

Many people believe that they are Christians because they were born in a religious home, go to church regularly, try to do their best, or live a "good" life. However, these things alone cannot reconcile us to God. Through the Bible, God tells us that our relationship with Him has been broken through sin and needs to be restored. The good news or "Gospel" of Jesus Christ is that God has restored our relationship with Him. The Bible says, "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him." John 3:16-17

When Christ died on the cross, He hung there in our place. He took the punishment you and I deserved. With His last words He declared, "It is finished." When He said this, it was as if God the Father sitting as a judge over the whole earth slammed his gavel down and declared the world not guilty. A pardon went out over the whole world. This is the truth; this is the objective reality. This objective reality must become personal. The message of the life, love and forgiveness of Christ must become mine, it must become yours, for it to be effective. If you believe that Jesus died on the cross for your sin and rose from the grave for you, then take these steps:

- * **ADMIT** that you have disobeyed God's laws (Romans 3:23)
- * **ASK** for forgiveness (Ephesians 1:7)
- * **RECEIVE** Christ into your life (John 1:12)
- * **DECLARE** Christ as the Lord of your life (1 John 2:23, Romans 10:10)
- * **DIG INTO** the word of God, the Bible. A good place to start is the gospel of John. If you do not have one we can get one for you.

Here is a prayer you may want to use:

Lord Jesus, thank you for your offer of Heaven and an abundant life for me. I confess to You that I have disobeyed You and ask You to forgive me and restore my relationship with the living God. Thank you for dying for my sins and providing a way that I can live forever. I believe in You, I ask You to come into my life, to be my leader and Savior. Thank you Jesus, Amen.
