Her (wisdom) ways are pleasant ways And all her paths are peace.


Proverbs 3:19-20

Of old you laid the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. They will perish, but you will remain; they will all wear out like a garment.












Physical Shalom

Social Shalom



When those who have money, power, status, resources are using, "weaving" all they are and have into their community (instead of keeping it all for themselves) There is an "inner wovenness", everyone is being care for, safe and held up by the fabric.

Social Insecurity









Jesus - "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions."





- 2. Those who Perception becomes reality









How do we do justice?



Justice and you Micah 6:8

He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.



Justice and you "Love Mercy" Consider Christ. We love because he first loved us. 1 John 4:19

- Born in a manger -family was poor
- He was homeless -"foxes have holes"
- cast lots for His only possession (robe)
- a victim of injustice was lynched

Justice and you "Walk Humbly"

We love the poor because we are the poor. Even if you have money we are the poor. We do not have the resources to save ourselves. And this keeps us humble.



The gospel makes us into righteous people who reweave the fabric of shalom through disadvantage ourselves for the sake of others.
